We sponsor over 350 Harvard College students through summer, winter break, and post-graduate work experiences.

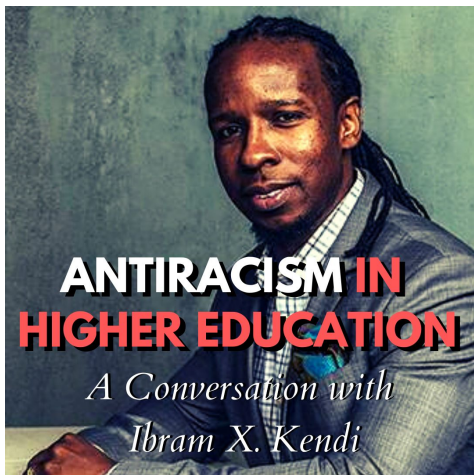


