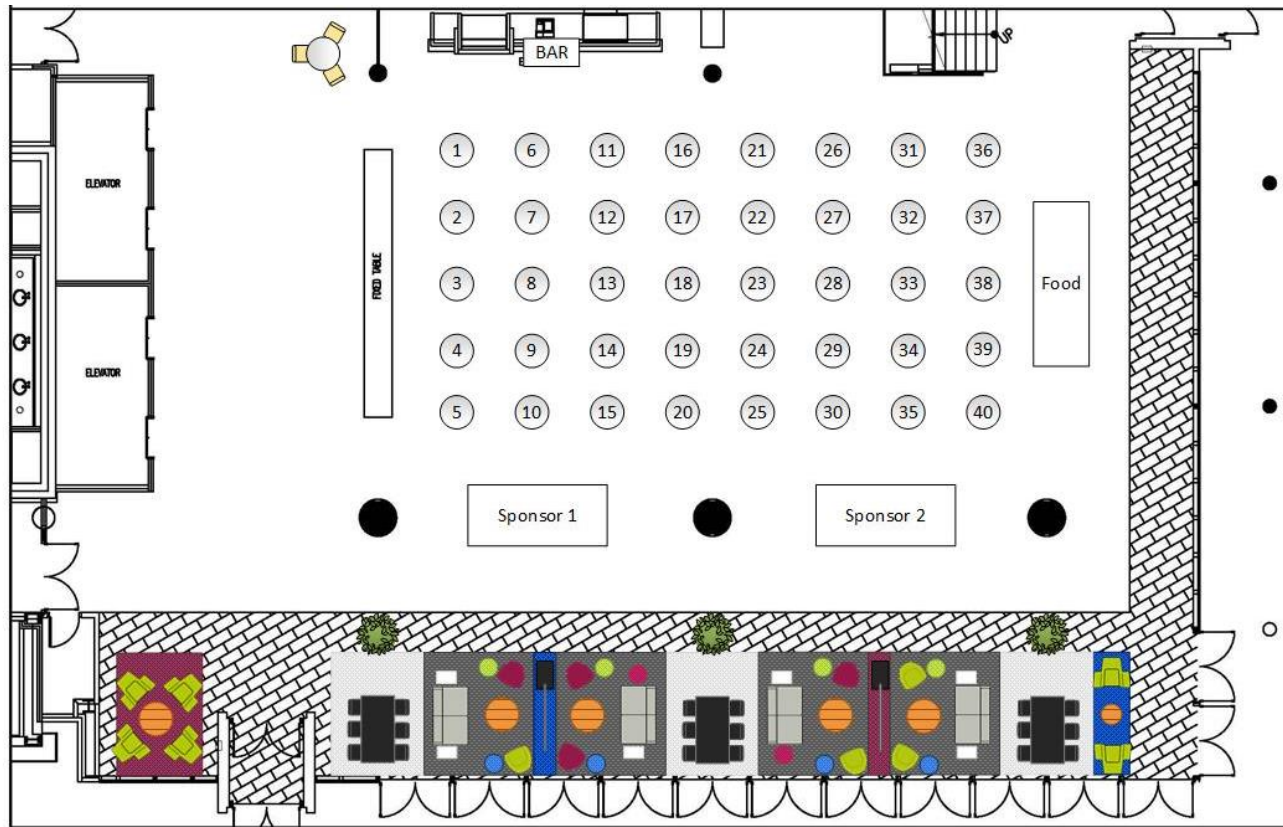

Dr. Toni Hoover, Director of Strategy Planning and Management for Global Health at the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, leads a team that is responsible for supporting the programs and functions with business strategy and operations, portfolio and project management, and engagement with product development partners. We also need more tutors to assist in the classroom, an incredibly rewarding experience, whether one is there for 2 hours a week or 20.
